WHO IS SPEECH PATHOLOGY FOR?

We support clients of all ages, including private clients, National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS) participants, and Enhanced Primary Care or Team Care Arrangements clients.

We welcome people with neurodiversity, intellectual disability, brain injury, developmental delay, and other children/young people or adults who may benefit.

WHAT DOES IT LOOK LIKE?

Assessment

- Speech Pathology typically starts with assessment of the specific areas of concern that have led a client to seek our services. For example, we might assess someone's receptive and expressive language (what they understand and what they say), or which sounds they are using when they are talking.
- Where possible, we take into account information from other practitioners, family members or educators.

Goal setting & intervention planning

• We then collaboratively develop goals and an intervention plan, which sometimes includes personalised resources (eg. flashcards).

Intervention

 The Speech Pathologist then leads the intervention (primarily in-clinic), complemented by home practice and other strategies.

ACCESSING SPEECH PATHOLOGY

Our Speech Pathology services can be accessed by:

PAYMENT PROCESS

Our Speech Pathology services are charged per hour. Some private clients may be able to claim through their health fund.

Speech Pathology is also funded through the National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS). As per the NDIS Pricing Arrangements and Price Limits guide, Speech Pathology utilises the following NDIS funding line:

 Capacity Building – Improved Daily Living
